Section 146A: Identity of protected person to be kept confidential

PROTECTIONS FOR WHISTLEBLOWERS

A person who reports what they believe on reasonable grounds to be improper conduct may have made a protected communication.

By making a protected communication, a person has taken a protected action. They are known as a protected person.

Protections for this person may include:

- protection against civil, criminal and disciplinary action for the making of a protected communication
- opportunity to provide information contrary to confidentiality obligations
- protection against retaliation.

The identity of a protected person must be kept confidential.

Under the ICAC Act, it is an offence to disclose the identity of a protected person.
